<p>5. Title, language and number of pages of the notified document: Draft Assessment for Application A564 – Food derived from insect-protected corn line LY038 (71 pages, in English).</p>

Description of content: FSANZ has received an Application to amend Standard 1.5.2 – Food Produced using Gene Technology in the <i>Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code</i> to approve the use of food products derived from genetically modified high lysine corn line LY038. Corn line LY038 has been developed primarily for animal feed, however some may inadvertently enter the food supply. Food derived from this corn could enter the market in Australia via imported products.</p>

All applications to change the Code must be assessed in the context of the following objectives: (a) the protection of public health and safety; (b) the provision of adequate information relating to food to enable consumers to make informed choices; and (c) the prevention of misleading or deceptive conduct.</p>
