2.2 Phytosanitary Import Permits

2.2.1 Phytosanitary import permits state the general phytosanitary requirements for importation

2.2.2 Phytosanitary import permits are required for all commodity classes exported from New Zealand

2.2.3 Import permits are normally valid for 6 months

- Phytosanitary import permit

Note: Where an importing country does not specify any quarantine pests within the above, the MPL of 5% is to be applied for all injurious pests. Refer Section 4.14.4 of PEO.OAR

3.2 Cut Flowers and Foliage

3.2.1 Fresh Cut Flowers and Foliage

Conditions:

Phytosanitary import permit required. Phytosanitary certificate required.

Note: Non-commercial consignments of flowers sourced from registered flower growers do not require an import permit or a phytosanitary certificate but must be accompanied by a receipt of purchase from a registered flower grower. The flowers will be subject to an inspection on arrival so it is important that the flowers be free from pests before leaving New Zealand.
