### **1.2 Scope**

This standard specifies Russia's phytosanitary requirements. If a commodity or commodity group is not identified within this ICPR exporters should contact:

- Russia directly to ascertain requirements
- or
- MAF Biosecurity New Zealand (MAFBNZ). (Plant Exports)

Please note, the determination and provision of phytosanitary requirements, for a commodity not identified within an ICPR, is undertaken on a cost recovery basis. A link to the list of Plant Exports Fees and Charges is available on

## **2 General requirements**

### **2.1 Prohibitions**

#### **Prohibited imports:**

- Regulated articles infested by quarantine pests (see lists of Quarantine Pests).
- Plant pathogens, living insects, mites and nematodes (except samples for scientific purposes).
- Soil, plants (including bulbs and tubers) accompanied by soil.
- Plants for planting (including seeds) of fruit, forest and ornamental crops from all countries where the pests mentioned

in the quarantine pest lists (Quarantine Pests section in this ICPR) occur (except materials for scientific purposes).

- Fruits and vegetables (in quantities exceeding 5 kg) transported by mail and by passengers
- Seeds and planting material transported in luggage, hand luggage and mail, without being accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate.
- Seeds of *Striga* spp.
- Litter made from materials of plant origin at imports of fruit and vegetables
- Fruit and vegetables for use as vegetable bed material.
- Grain imported for processing must not be used for any other end purposes (i.e. sowing)

### **Regulated articles:**

The Russian Federal Service for Veterinary and Phytosanitary Surveillance (VPSS) publishes a list of quarantine products that are subject to state phytosanitary quarantine control.

Where “From...” is used before a TC the requirements are not applied to all commodities that are classified in accordance with this code. In these cases it is necessary to be guided by more detailed description of the specific commodity in the code’s group.

Products included in this ICPR have been extracted from the VPSS official document on products that are subject to quarantine and phytosanitary regulations.

This list consists of two categories:

#### **I Quarantine products with high pest risk**

- Phytosanitary certificate required.
- Import permit not required.
- Subject to inspection on arrival.

#### **II Quarantine products with low pest risk**

- Phytosanitary certificate not required.
- Import permit not required.
- Subject to inspection on arrival.

Products are grouped in accordance with Russia's Codes of Customs Nomenclature of Foreign Economic Activity of the Russian Federation (Russia's VED Tariff Code) available here:

All regulated articles must be imported through specified customs offices.

## 2.2 Phytosanitary Import Permits

### Import permits:

Import **permits are not required** for plants and plant products.

### Labeling:

Each package must be marked with:

- Product type;
- Country of origin;
- Exporter and/or re-exporter name;

**Planting seed, planting material**

- **Must also include location and/or production site details**

## 2.3 Phytosanitary Certificates

1. All exports categorised by the Customs Union as quarantine products with high pest risk must be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate.

2. Phytosanitary certificates must be issued prior to loading the vessel or aircraft. Phytosanitary certificate issuance dates must therefore be the same or earlier than the Bill of Lading date.

2. If the products are not included in this ICPR, the import permit and phytosanitary certificate for these products (material, cargo) **may be issued** on the official request of the national plant protection **organisation** of the importing country.

4. Transport means and transport facilities such as containers, used for shipments of quarantine products, as well as those which may carry quarantine pests, are subject to mandatory cleaning and disinfection if needed, in compliance with the rules and norms for ensuring plant quarantine according to Article 9 of the Federal Law # 99-FZ “on Plant Quarantine enacted July 15, 2000”.

### **2.5 Maximum Pest Limits (MPL's)**

For all commodities exported to Russia requiring phytosanitary certificates, MPL's are:

Quarantine pests\* specified by Russia 0.5%

Please note; for all seed commodities exported to the Russian Federation requiring MAF phytosanitary certificates, the following level has been set by MAF to facilitate exports while still meeting the importing country's minimum requirements for soil.

Soil (seed for sowing) 0.1% by weight

A mixture of soil in potatoes and other tuberous plants and root vegetables shall not exceed more than 1 % of the weight of the product

\*Quarantine pests for Russia include organisms identified within:

- Quarantine pests listed in this ICPR
- Additional declarations
- Phytosanitary import permit

Note: Where an importing country does not specify any quarantine pests within the above, the MPL of 5% is to be applied for all injurious pests. Refer Section 4.14.4 of PEO.OAR

### **2.6 Inspection on Arrival**

At point of entry, seed and planting material consignments may have their phytosanitary certificate inspected and may be subject to visual inspection.

### 3 Commodity Class Requirements

#### 3.1 Fruit and Vegetables

##### 3.1.1 Fresh Fruit and Vegetables

Conditions:

Phytosanitary import permit not required. Phytosanitary certificate required. Refer Section 4.1.

Packaging must be labelled with:

- product type
- Country of origin
- Name of exporter and/or re-exporter.

A mixture of soil in potatoes and other tuberous plants and root vegetables shall not exceed more than 1 % of the weight of the product

Notes:

1. The Russian Federation allows the import of fruit damaged by Mediterranean fruit fly (*Ceratitidis capitata*) and fruit borer (*Conotrachelus nenuphar*), both of which New Zealand currently has country freedom from.
2. The Russian Federation will allow the import and sale of stone and pome fruit crops damaged by *Grapholita molesta* and *Carpocapsa niponensis* year round, north of the border zone of potential habitat, located on the line connecting the cities of Petrozavodsk, Syktyvkar, Solikamsk, Perm, Ekaterinburg (Yekaterinburg), Omsk, Tomsk, Krasnoyarsk, Irkutsk, Ulan-Ude, Chita, Blagoveshchensk, Khabarovsk, Alexandrovsk-Sakhalinsky.
3. The Russian Federation will allow the import and sale of stone and pome fruit crops damaged by *Grapholita molesta* and *Carpocapsa niponensis* south of the line described above (note 1) from October 15<sup>th</sup> till April 15<sup>th</sup>. Between April 16<sup>th</sup> and October 14<sup>th</sup> stone fruit must be completely free of damage caused by *Grapholita molesta* and *Carpocapsa niponensis*.
4. Imports of fruits damaged by the Mediterranean fruit moth (*Ceratitidis capitata*) and fruit weevil (*Conotrachelus nenuphar*) to zone located north of the administrative borders of Rostov and Voronezh oblasts is allowed without restriction; and to the zone located south of the border imports is allowed in the period from November 1<sup>st</sup> to March 31<sup>st</sup>. At imports of citrus fruits damaged by the Mediterranean fruit moth (*Ceratitidis capitata*) and fruit weevil (*Conotrachelus nenuphar*) through the southern ports of the Black and Azov Seas shipments of these fruits is allowed to the regions located north of the administrative border of Rostov and Voronezh oblasts under the condition that they are transported in refrigerated trucks and refrigerated sections of road and rail means of transport without the right to sell these fruits south of these borders.
5. The use of fruits damaged by the Mediterranean fruit moth (*Ceratitidis capitata*) and fruit weevil (*Conotrachelus nenuphar*) south of the

administrative borders of Rostov and Voronezh oblasts is allowed for the entire year after prophylactic disinfection.

Conditions:

Phytosanitary import permit not required. Phytosanitary certificate may or may not be required. Refer Section 4.1.

Other conditions:

Packaging should be labelled with information about the types of products, country of origin, exporter and/or re-exporter.

### 3.1.3 Frozen Fruit and Vegetables

Conditions:

Phytosanitary import permit not required. Phytosanitary certificate may or may not be required. Refer Section 4.1.

Other conditions:

Packaging should be labelled with information about the types of products, country of origin, exporter and/or re-exporter.

## 3.2 Cut Flowers and Foliage

### 3.2.1 Fresh Cut Flowers and Foliage

Conditions:

Phytosanitary import permit not required. Phytosanitary certificate required.

Packaging must be labelled with:

- product type
- country of origin
- name of exporter and/or re-exporter

### 3.2.2 Dried Cut Flowers and Foliage

Conditions:

Phytosanitary import permit not required. Phytosanitary certificate required.

## 3.3 Nursery Stock

### 3.3.1 Budwood/Cuttings

Conditions:

Phytosanitary import permit not required. Phytosanitary certificate required.

Other conditions:

Plants should be dormant, without leaves, flowers and fruit (including fruits, berries, grapes and ornamental plants (except strawberries)).

Import of planting materials of plants from areas widespread with *Quadraspidiotus perniciosus* and *Pseudaulacaspis pentagona* is allowed provided decontamination of plant in New Zealand, which shall

be confirmed by the relevant information in the Additional Declaration of the phytosanitary certificate.

Packaging must be labelled with:

- Product type
- Country of origin
- Name of exporter and/or re-exporter
- Location and/or production site details

**Note:** budwood and cutting shall be subject to laboratory inspection in order to detect quarantine pests.

### 3.3.2 Bulbs/tubers/corms/rhizomes etc.

Conditions:

Phytosanitary import permit not required. Phytosanitary certificate required.

Other conditions:

Plants should be dormant, without leaves, flowers and fruit (Including fruits, berries, grapes and ornamental plants (except strawberries)).

Import of planting materials of plants from areas widespread with *Quadraspidiotus perniciosus* and *Pseudaulacaspis pentagona* is allowed provided decontamination of plant in New Zealand, which shall be confirmed by the relevant information in the Additional Declaration of the phytosanitary certificate.

Packaging must be labelled with:

- Product type
- Country of origin
- Name of exporter and/or re-exporter
- Location and/or production site details

**Note:** Planting material shall be subject to laboratory inspection in order to detect quarantine pests.

### 3.3.3 Whole Plants

Conditions:

Phytosanitary import permit not required. Phytosanitary certificate may or may not be required.

Other conditions:

Plants should be dormant, without leaves, flowers and fruit (Including fruits, berries, grapes and ornamental plants (except strawberries)).

Import of planting materials of plants from areas widespread with *Quadraspidiotus perniciosus* and *Pseudaulacaspis pentagona* is allowed, provided decontamination is applied in New Zealand, which shall be confirmed by the relevant information in the Additional Declaration of the phytosanitary certificate.

Packaging must be labelled with:

- Product type

- Country of origin
- Name of exporter and/or re-exporter
- Location and/or production site details

Note: Planting material shall be subject to laboratory inspection in order to detect quarantine pests.

Conditions:

## 3.4 Seed, Grains and Nuts

### 3.4.1 Seed, Grains and Nuts for Sowing

Conditions:

Phytosanitary import permit not required. Phytosanitary certificate required. Additional Declaration required.

Other conditions:

Each lot of seed shall be subject to laboratory examination for detection of quarantine pests.

Tolerance of soil in the seed lots shall not exceed 0.1% of the weight of the product.

Packaging must be labelled with:

- Product type
- Country of origin
- Name of exporter and/or re-exporter
- Location and/or production site details

Additional declaration:

Import of seed from areas widespread of *Quadraspidiotus perniciosus* and *Pseudaulacaspis pentagona* is allowed provided decontamination of seed in New Zealand, which shall be confirmed by the relevant information in the Additional Declaration of the phytosanitary certificate.

**Note:**

1. If *Callosobruchus* spp. are detected in seed, seed is to be disinfected, reshipped or destroyed.
2. Seeds shall be subject to laboratory inspection in order to detect quarantine pests.
