Dog: No Veterinary Certification and Laboratory Reports

CTO direction to biosecurity inspectors for the clearance of a dog: Microchip number 985 111 000 128 467

Pursuant to section 27(1)(d)(iii) of the Biosecurity Act 1993 I, Lucy Johnston, Acting Manager Animal Imports, Ministry for Primary Industries (under delegated authority), give the following directions for a dog to be given clearance in accordance with the following measures, different from those in the applicable import health standard *Cats and Dogs from Approved Countries* [CATDOG.GEN dated 28 November 2014]:

Equivalence is given from clause 1.10 (b) and (c) (veterinary certification and laboratory reports) of the IHS based on the dog having satisfactorily completed all relevant tests, treatments, and examinations in post-arrival quarantine. Clearance can be given once the dog is compliant with all other import requirements.

The reason for directing clearance is that the biosecurity risks associated with this CTO direction have been assessed and are managed effectively.

This direction takes effect from the date of signing and continues in effect until amended or revoked.
