1. Statutory authority

Pursuant to section 60, section 60A, section 62(1) and section 167 of the Animal Products Act 1999 I notify the following:

(i) the issue under section 60 of the overseas market access requirements for dogs and cats to St Maarten PETANI.SX dated 09 February 2017;

(ii) the determination under section 62(1) of the format and content of the official assurance for dogs and cats to St Maarten.

This notice takes effect from 09 February 2017.

2. St Maarten requirements

Dogs and cats exported from New Zealand to St Maarten must be accompanied by an Official Assurance in the form of a completed zoosanitary certificate.

The zoosanitary certificate as specified below must be completed and certified, after due enquiry, by an Official Veterinarian of the Ministry for Primary Industries.

Explanatory Note: If the zoosanitary certificate is not certified then the dogs and cats do not satisfy the conditions in the notice. Likewise, if the dogs and cats do not satisfy the zoosanitary requirements in the certificate, then the certificate will not be certified.

I,, being an Official Veterinarian of the New Zealand government, certify, after due enquiry, with respect to the animal(s) identified in this Zoosanitary Certificate that:

1. In the case of dogs and cats:

- 1.1 The animal is not less than thirteen (13) weeks of age at the date of export.
- 1.2 The animal has been vaccinated with inactivated rabies vaccine not less than thirty (30) days and not more than one (1) year to three (3) years as registered by the manufacturer prior to the date of export.

1.3 The animal is free of internal parasites as determined by a negative faecal floatation test and has been treated within twenty one (21) days prior to departure with a registered medicine as instructed by the manufacturer.

1.4 The animal is free from external parasites particulary *Amblyomma sp.* and *Boophilus sp.* The animal has been treated with a registered insecticide within fourteen days (14) prior to departure.

- 1.5 The animal has been examined within fourteen days (14) days prior to the scheduled date of export and is found to be free from ectoparasites and clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease and observable cutaneous diseases and is fit to travel.
- 1.6 The animals cage meets the IATA requirements
- 2. In the case of dogs:
 - 2.1 The dog has been fully vaccinated against Canine distemper, canine parvovirus, infectious canine hepatitis, and Leptospirosis and Adenovirus, according to manufacturer instructions.
- 3. In the case of cats:

3.1 The cat has been fully vaccinated against Feline Rhinotraceitis, Feline Calcivirus, Feline Panleukopenia and FIV according to manufacturer instructions.

NOTES:

- 1. An import permit is required.
- 2. The importation of a pit-bull terrier type dog is not permitted.
- 3. The animals must be presented to a licensed veterinarian within three (3) days of arrival in St Maarten. A copy of the Export Certificate and the import permit must be submitted to the Inspections Department TEZVT LVV, St Maarten. *This is not mandatory, especially if the pet is a frequent flyer*
- 4. If you are planning on returning to New Zealand with your pet in the future, please contact the animal imports group at MPI to obtain information on importing pets back in New Zealand. We strongly suggest that this is done before your pet is exported from New Zealand as not every country can meet the New Zealand import conditions, and so you may not be able to import your pet back into New Zealand.
