

- Priority goes to essential repairs to continue farming: boundary fencing; access tracks and stock water supplies.
- Any grant will be a contribution towards repairs, up to 50% of the cost.
- The damage must exceed \$12,000 and an excess of \$5000 is deducted from the 50% that is eligible for funding.
- The maximum any one entity could receive from the Fund is \$50,000.
- Funding may be available where the cost of repairs is higher than limited insurance cover.
- Funding is not available for repairs that can be insured, but were not.

### WHAT DO I DO NEXT?

You have until 31 March to apply. Your costs can be estimates. You do not need to have the work completed. You can find the form and a full list of questions and answers on the Marlborough District Council website. More information is also on the Rural Support Trust website. Or call one of the MPI Recovery Coordinators.

Accessing the fund is not asking for a handout; it is instead a hand up for you, your family, your community and your farm. It will not come at the expense of anyone else and you are supporting each other and the sector by supporting yourselves.

Applying to the fund also gives the government an indication of what challenges the Hurunui farming community is facing with the compounding disasters of earthquakes and drought.

Farming in this region has been beset by challenges recently and you don't have to manage alone. ## CALLING ALL EARTHQUAKE-AFFECTED FARMERS:

### Have you applied for a grant from the Primary Industries Earthquake Relief Fund?

**Apply before 31 March. Your costs can be estimates, and the fund will be used to pay up to 50 percent of costs associated with repairing uninsurable infrastructure.**

### WHAT IS THE PRIMARY INDUSTRIES EARTHQUAKE RELIEF FUND?

The Government announced \$4 million to help towards repair costs for uninsurable infrastructure repairs across the Hurunui, Kaikōura and Marlborough districts.

### WHO CAN APPLY?

Rural people whose principal income comes from a primary industry.

Grants from the fund can help pay for costs associated with:

- Restoring uninsurable primary sector infrastructure
- Re-establishing uninsurable pasture (on cultivatable land only), crops, and forestry
- Initial clean-up of silt and debris (where uninsurable).

**This could include: some on-farm access roads, tracks, races, bridges without sides, dams and reservoirs.**
