# New Zealand (Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code) Food Standards 2002, Amendment No. 74

The Minister for Food Safety, under section 400 of the Food Act 2014, issues the following amendment to the New Zealand (Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code) Food Standards 2002.

#### 1. Title

These standards are the New Zealand (Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code) Food Standards 2002, Amendment No. 74.

#### 2. Commencement

This amendment comes into force on the date it is signed by the Minister.

#### 3. Amendments

The New Zealand (Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code) Food Standards 2002 are amended by omitting clause 4 and substituting the following clause:

### 4 The Food Standards Code

- (1) Under sections 397 and 400 of the Food Act 2014, these standards adopt the Food Standards Code, as amended, up to and including amendment No. 171 to the Food Standards Code, but these standards do not adopt amendment No. 169.
- (2) Despite clause 4(1), these standards do not adopt those parts of the Food Standards Code identified in the Food Standards Code as applying only in Australia.

# **Explanatory note**

This note is not part of the standards and has been included to explain their general effect.

The New Zealand (Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code) Food Standards 2002, Amendment No. 74 adopts Amendments No. 171 to the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code into New Zealand domestic law (except any Australia-only variation).

The New Zealand (Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code) Foods Standards 2002, Amendment No. 74 came into effect on the date it was signed by the Minister.

Amendment No. 171 amends the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code to approve the following application:

• Application A1123 – Isomalto-oligosaccharide as a Novel Food

# Food standards subject to Legislation Act 2012

Food standards, including this amendment, are disallowable instruments, but not legislative instruments, for the purposes of the Legislation Act 2012 and must be presented to the House of Representatives under section 41 of that Act. Any person has the right to make a complaint about a food standard to the Regulations Review Committee.
