CTO direction to biosecurity inspectors for the clearance of products that have not been certified by the manufacturer as having been kept separate from product of equivalent health status.

Pursuant to section 27(1)(d)(iii) of the Biosecurity Act 1993 I, Lucy Johnston, Senior Adviser, Ministry for Primary Industries (under delegated authority), give the following directions for egg products to be given clearance in accordance with the following measures, different from those in the import health standard for shelf-stable spray dried egg powders or egg crystals from specified countries. (Poueggic.spe)

Where the egg product is packaged in original sealed, tamper proof, clean packaging, the requirement for the manufacturer's declaration to state the name and address of the New Zealand importer and that the product has remained separated from non-processed product and product not of equivalent zoosanitary status, may be waived as it is considered the biosecurity risks of the product is equivalently managed

This direction takes effect from the date of signing and continues in effect until amended or revoked.
