Inedible Animal Products: Bulk Shipments

CTO direction to Biosecurity inspectors for the clearance of bulk shipments of inedible animal products lanolin and highly processed collagen/protein products for further processing in New Zealand.

Pursuant to section 27(1)(d)(iii) of the Biosecurity Act 1993 I, Marnie Thomas, Manager Animal Imports, Ministry for Primary Industries (under delegated authority), give the following directions for bulk shipments of commercially manufactured inedible animal products lanolin and highly processed collagen/protein products for further processing in New Zealand to be given clearance in accordance with the following measures, different from Clauses 6.17 and 6.25 respectively, in the applicable import health standard Specified foods for Human Consumption Containing Animal Products (INEPROIC.ALL):

Bulk shipments of commercially manufactured lanolin and lanolin based products from any country may be given clearance for further processing in New Zealand

Bulk shipments of commercially manufactured collagen/protein products from any country may be given clearance for further processing in New Zealand

When commercially produced, these products do not represent Biosecurity risk. The only difference is that bulk shipments for further processing will not be packaged in consumer-ready commercial packaging on arrival in New Zealand.

The reason for directing clearance is that the Biosecurity risks associated with this CTO direction have been assessed and are managed effectively.

This direction takes effect from the date of signing and continues in effect until amended or revoked.
