NOTIFICATION OF KAHUTARA, OARO, AND TUTAEPUTAPUTA MĀTAITAI RESERVES AND TĀNGATA TIAKI/KAITIAKI

Pursuant to Regulation 22 of the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Regulations 1999, the Director-General of the Ministry for Primary Industries gives the following notice.

Pursuant to regulation 20 of the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Regulations 1999, by notice in the New Zealand Gazette published on 12 September 2018, the Minister of Fisheries declared the Kahutara, Oaro, and Tutaeputaputa Mātaimai Reserves. The Kahutara and Tutaeputaputa Mātaimai Reserves are over the lower parts of the Kahutara and Conway Rivers, Kaikōura, respectively. The Oaro Mātaimai Reserve is over the fisheries waters defined by Schedule 4 of the Kaikōura (Te Tai o Marokura) Marine Management Act 2014 as the Oaro Mātaimai, plus the lower reaches of the Oaro River.

The full description of the boundaries of the Mātaimai Reserves are included in the Fisheries (Declaration of Kahutara Mātaimai Reserve) Notice 2018; the Fisheries (Declaration of Tutaeputaputa Mātaimai Reserve) Notice 2018; and the Fisheries (Declaration of Oaro Mātaimai Reserve) Notice 2018.

Pursuant to regulation 21 of the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Regulations 1999, in an instrument dated 18 August 2018, the Minister of Fisheries appointed Maria Andrea Clayton, Brett Cowan, Nukuroa Tirikatene-Nash, Sir Mark Solomon, Gina Solomon, Keepa Te Rangihiniwi Timms (Major), Debbie Walford, Jeff Reardon, and Tauki Manawatu as Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki for all three Mātaimai Reserves. The appointments are for a term of five years.

The Mātaimai Reserves and appointment of Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki take effect from Wednesday, 10 October 2018.

A mātaimai reserve is an identified traditional fishing ground managed by the tangata whenua through Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki.

The Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki may authorise any individual to take fish, aquatic life or seaweed for customary food gathering purposes from within the whole or any part of the mātaimai reserve. No fishing for customary food gathering purposes may take place in the mātaimai reserve without authorisation from the Tangata Tiaki/Kaitiaki.

Commercial fishing within a mātaimai reserve is prohibited under regulation 24(2) of the Fisheries (South Island Customary Fishing) Regulations 1999.
