

Compensation vs Operational

Examples where losses and costs may occur due to the Mycoplasma bovis Response

Compensation Loss

You may be eligible to claim compensation if you have incurred a loss due to the Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) exercise of powers or restrictions under the **Biosecurity Act 1993 (the Act) section 162A**.

Examples include damage to or destruction of property and losses as a result of restrictions imposed on the movement or disposal of goods (e.g. animals). Refer to **www.mbovis.govt.nz** 'Costs & Compensation' section for relevant frequently asked questions (FAQs) and a compensation claim form.

Operational Cost

You can apply for support for some on-farm operational costs if there is an urgent need (such as feed shortages) or to meet MPI's requirements.

Costs need pre-approval before the expenditure is incurred. Work with your Incident Control Point (ICP) Manager and the MPI Regional Recovery team, who will help you to have these approved.

Beef Production Loss

Compensation Loss – MPI's exercise of powers have incurred a loss, such as a Notice of Direction (NOD) to destroy your stock earlier than usual (and at a lesser weight).

You are eligible to claim compensation for future loss of meat production due to MPI's direction.

Bull Servicing Income

Compensation Loss – you have incurred a loss due to an exercise of powers. For example, the bulls were prevented from moving off and/or on the farm due to a NOD or a Restricted Place (RP) notice.

Cleaning

Operational Cost – costs associated with additional cleaning that is required under a NOD and/or RP notice.

Any costs associated with cleaning an infected property will be managed by your ICP manager, and Cleaning and Disinfection (C&D) coordinator.

Equipment Hire

Operational Cost – when hiring additional farm equipment is required to ensure animal welfare and for farming operations to continue.

Feed

Operational Cost – when feed is required to ensure the welfare of animals under movement restriction or where the animals cannot be moved off the property.

Fencing

Operational Cost – existing fencing is not adequate to contain animals for the protection of neighbouring farms.

Costs may include hiring additional casual labour and/or temporary fencing materials.

Milk Production

Compensation Loss – MPI's powers must have caused you a consequential loss in milk production. For example, either by a direction to destroy the dairy herd or movement controls placed on the farm has disrupted milk production.

Mustering

Operational costs – when you are required to muster cattle for the purposes of census or for each round of sampling. The farm must be under surveillance or Section 122 NOD restrictions.

Please request a Mustering Payments fact sheet from your ICP manager or Regional Recovery team manager or refer to the website.

Stock Destruction

Compensation loss – when you were issued a NOD to destroy your stock. Loss from stock destruction is calculated from the total value of animals, less meat value received from the meat processor.

Stock Replacement

Compensation loss – your loss may have been caused by the price for replacement stock has increased between the date your infected stock were culled and the date when you were able to restock the farm.

Transport

Operational costs – may include the following:

- When transporting stock to the meat processors and specific M. bovis C&D of the stock truck.
- M. bovis processing charges incurred from the meat processer (unless already paid by MPI).
- Cost for transporting replacement stock if you were issued a NOD to destroy your original stock.

Vet Charges

Operational costs – you may be reimbursed or MPI may pay for certifying that your animals are fit for transport.

COMPENSATION – if you have experienced a **loss** due to an exercise of powers by MPI, you will need to submit a completed compensation claim form and send it to MPI Compensation.
