Winter Grazing Taskforce

TERMS OF REFERENCE

Purpose

 Propose mitigations for short, medium and long-term, evidence-based animal welfare improvement to support behaviour change so that all farmers comply with animal welfare requirements.

Expectations for work delivery

- Identify key animal welfare risks and mitigations associated with intensive winter grazing on crop.
- Identify a set of practical, pan-sector initiatives to improve animal welfare in intensive winter grazing practices, focussed on education (including farmers, public), policy, operational, compliance and research needs.
- Draw on advice and expertise from various groups and individuals outside the Taskforce across the country, who can inform and challenge the taskforce's thinking.
- Milestones for actions to be set within this season, and onwards.
