## Item 1 - Text message notification

In considering release of the text message under the Official Information Act (the Act) I have considered the purpose of the Act, whether there are good reasons for withholding the information under section 6 of the Act, and whether good reason exists for withholding under section 9 of the Act - weighed against the public interest in releasing.

There are good reasons under section 6(a) of the Act why the message should not be released in full. A consequence of withholding part of the message under section 6(a) is to distort the information conveyed by the message. For this reason, I am releasing the following summary of the text message, consistent with section 16(1)(e) of the Act.

On 14 May 2013 at 10:53am (NZ standard time), the Director-General Wayne McNee sent a text message to Minister Guy and Minister Kaye.

The message advised of a problem with China refusing to accept export certificates for NZ Meat under the competent authority "MPI" rather than "NZFSA". The message stated the action being taken by MPI to resolve, and that while it may require escalation of the problem to Ministerial level, it also suggested the situation was not unusual.

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To date we have supplied AQSIQ with information on 563 containers which are believed to be at ports and 617 still to land. There will be a lack of clarity with some of the detained ones: ,

Also, we have heard of one high-value chilled (therefore perishable) beef shipment, detained on arrival, which was already cleared by AQSIQ over the weekend once they had our consignment information.

Staff at New Zealand's embassy in China are working with the Chinese inspection and quarantine authorities to clear a number of meat consignments that are currently held up at the Chinese border.

MPI understands that the Chinese authorities have no concerns relating to the safety or suitability of the meat. The holdup is solely due to confusion around the accompanying export certificates.

On 1 March 2013 all export certificates to all markets issued by MPI were changed to reflect its new name. At the time that the MPI certificates changed, New Zealand was in discussion with the Chinese authorities around arrangements for exports of New Zealand meat to China. It seems that the two issues got confused.

MPI understands that none of the detained meat has had to be reshipped or destroyed.

Any consignments of New Zealand meat about to arrive in China will be progressively cleared by the Chinese authorities with assistance from MPI and the New Zealand Embassy.

## Background

1. The MPI name change (which became effective for all export certification on 1 March 2013) was advised via formal letter in October 2012. This was following an earlier general advice about the Ministry name change in June 2012.
2. For China, this was also followed up during the Joint Management Committee meetings held in Beijing in November 2012. MPI also wrote to the Chinese Authorities (along with all others) in January / February 2013 and provided samples of the updated certificates which were to come into force on 1 March 2013.
3. The change happened for all products exported to China on 1 March.
4. From mid-April MPI started hearing from companies of delays in clearances for meat products.



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5. MPI officials have been working overnight to extract the reports and the first of these has been provided to the NZ Embassy. We have also organised a special

## Statement from the Ministry for Primary Industries on meat detained in China

A number of consignments of New Zealand meat are currently held up at the Chinese border.

MPI has been informed that the Chinese authorities have no concerns relating to the safety or suitability of the meat. The holdup is solely due to confusion around the accompanying export certificates. This appears to stem from a change to all export certificates issued by MPI, which occurred on 1 March 2013.

Staff at New Zealand's embassy in China are working with the Chinese inspection and quarantine authorities to clear the meat consignments that are currently held up at the Chinese border.

Because the situation changes daily, we do not know exactly how much meat is still detained.

MPI understands that none of the detained meat has had to be reshipped or destroyed. Most of the product is frozen. MPI understands that any chilled meat has been given priority clearance.

Any consignments of New Zealand meat about to arrive in China will be progressively cleared by the Chinese authorities with assistance from MPI and the New Zealand Embassy.

As far as MPI is aware, this issue is restricted to access for meat into China.

MPI is working with the New Zealand meat industry to ensure they are kept up to date on developments.

## Will the holdup result in loss of product?

None of the detained meat has been reshipped or destroyed. Most of the product is frozen and remains refrigerated. MPI has been told that any chilled meat is being given priority clearance.

Any consignments of New Zealand meat about to arrive in China will be progressively cleared by the Chinese authorities with assistance from MPI and the New Zealand Embassy.

When will the situation be resolved?
MPI and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade (MFAT) are working around the clock to provide technical information, documentation and assurance from New Zealand, so Chinese officials can proceed with clearance.

## Actions to assist Clearance

4. MPI are working with officials in the market with a view to reissuing all certificates for meat consignments that are held up at ports or on the water under the NZFSA name. We are expecting final confirmation from China tonight that this will be an acceptable way forward.
5. New certificate templates will be issued as an interim solution - they will be the same as the old NZFSA ones with the exception that the templates will have new version numbers.
6. MPI is making the IT changes in the AP E cert system at the moment and we have organised for certifying veterinarians to begin working with the oldest of the held shipments as the first priority (around 600 containers).
7. This will require URGENT intervention by exporters using the normal "replacement certificate" function - we will be working with MIA and directly with exporters to confirm actions that need to be taken.

9. We will also be sending copies (of as many certificates as
possible but including the priority ones) to Beijing tomorrow night. They will be hand carried by a senior MPI official.

## Shipments of Meat to China

What is the problem?
This issue is that some shipments of meat to China are being detained at the border. MPI do not have precise details of the product detained but we understand from advice from the industry that total product on hold and on the water is a significant volume (could be up to 1500 containers).

It is a technical problem and holdups such as this are not uncommon with importing countries - the issue is the scale. The New Zealand Embassy is confident that we have a way to progress the clearance of product detained and on the water.

What are we doing to fix it?

ISSUE:
During the course of the Ministry name change project, a number of items have been raised that need to be altered,
Until such a time as these decisions are made, we are unable to notify markets of the changes to our security devices.
Decisions are required in each of the following six areas, as detailed below:

1. Security paper - how many different types
2. Security paper - details of design
3. Use of Official Seals
4. Use of personal name identification stamps including job descriptions on certificates
5. Certificate template name details

## BACKGROUND:

1. Historically, we have had several different types of security paper. The recommendation is that we consolidate this level down to two different types.

- First - AP e-cert security paper which is proposed to remain the same, with no changes to format. However in terms of systems, we propose that the Animal Exports team shifts to using this type of paper.
- The second- will replace all other types of security paper (such as Plant Exports e-phyto certificates and hard copy paper AgM certificates that are still required in 8 different markets).
Reasons for these two:
- AP e-cert security paper currently references "New Zealand SPS Ceríficate" in the background but not all certificates issued from the Plant Exports group are for SPS purposes.
- A change in AP e-cert paper to say something else.
- AP e-cert paper (per page) is numbered and the majority of the MA councillors believe it should stay
this way.
- Two types of paper would allow current systems to continue with minimal training/disruption

2. As discussed above, the recommendations are the following in terms of the design for two types of security paper:

- AP e-cert remains unchanged, with

- New paper design

3. The following designs for new Ministry for Primary Industries seals have been confirmed and agreed with the manufacturer. A decision is required around the use of the seals, this is no longer straight forward given the different policies around the use of each kind.
4. Personal identification stamps are currently used on a range of certification. Some of these stamps are produced for individuals on behalf of MPI, while others are obtained by individuals personally, to avoid writing/typing the same information onto a certificate every time they issue one.

- Example One: Official Veterinarian - these are personalised stamps, and a technical brief will be going out advising individuals who own these stamps that they must either a) not use them after 1 March 2012, or b) must arrange themselves to replace them before 1 March 2012.
- Example Two: Official Inspector - these stamps are for the same purpose as outined above except are produced for individuals on behalf of the Ministry. The risk is all stamps will now say "Official Seal" where historically they have indicated a job title e.g. "Official Inspector." ## Nomenclature changes to New Zealand Export Certificates and Official Seals and Devices

On 30 April 2012 the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry (MAF) changed its name to the Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI). This was to reflect the new functions of the Ministry following the New Zealand Government's decision to merge MAF with the New Zealand Food Safety Authority (NZFSA) and the Ministry of Fisheries (Mfish). These functions cover the horticulture, agriculture, aquaculture, fisheries, forestry and food sectors, and include protecting New Zealand primary industries from biological risk.

MPI is the New Zealand competent authority for all sanitary and phytosanitary matters, including those relating to food safety, animal and plant life and health. Given its broad functions and areas of accountability, MPI is the gateway to government for all of New Zealand's primary industries.

A communication from the New Zealand Government in March 2012 advised of the name change and noted that nomenclature changes would be required in the future for all official assurances (export certification) and associated security devices (e.g. security paper, official seals, official devices and stamps) to reflect the new name of the New Zealand competent authority. Changes to our export certificates and associated security devices will take effect from 1 March 2013. This letter provides an overview of the changes that will be made to New Zealand's export certificates.

Attached to this letter are four generic samples of MPI export certificates for dairy products, meat producis, plant products, and live animalsigermplasm, which are intended to demonstrate the changes to our export certificates. These are only generic certificate examples and are not replicates of the certificates that will be used for exports to your country. Also attached as appendix one is a scanned copy of the two versions of official stamps, one of which will appear on MPI export certificates.

## Legislative Changes Required

If legislative changes are needed in your country to reflect the change of the name of the New Zealand competent authority on export cerificates and associated security devices, please ensure any necessary legislative changes are completed prior to the 1 March 2013 implementation date outlined in this letter.

You can contact MPI via the New Zealand High Commission/Embassy accredited to your country or alternatively, by emailing market.accessompi.govi.nz should you have any questions.

## Transitional Period

Please note that there will be a transition period during which border officials may receive boit the existing and new export certificate femplates. This is due to those export certificates issued prior to 1 March 2013 being in

the current format, and those certificates issued from 1 March 2013 being in the new format, and reflects the shipping times from New Zealand to other countries.

In addition, this transition period also affects New Zealand exports which may be presented to border officials with the current official seals and official devices after 1 March 2013. This is unavoidable as product sealed prior to 1 March 2013 with current carton seals and then chilled or frozen, cannot be replaced with new seals, as these will not permanently adhere to chilled or frozen product cartons.

## Changes to Export Certificates

References on all New Zealand export certificates to the Ministry of Agriculture and Forest (MAF), the New Zealand Food Safety Authority (NZFSA), and the Ministry of Fisheries (MFish) will be removed and replaced with the words 'New Zealand Minisitry for Primary Industries', 'Ministry for Primary Industries' or 'MP1'. This includes references made in relation to attestations/declarations, titles/headers of certificates, and references to the competent authority.

The export certificates affected include all ceritifcates for animal products Shuman, animal and inedible product), food and beverages, live animals and germplasm, and plant and plant products, and the IUU fish catch certificates.

Please note that no changes will be made to the aciual assurances provided by the New Zealand Government in the export certificates.

The security paper for sanitary export certificates for animal products (meat, dairy, seafood, non-edible etc), and IUU fish catch certificates will remain unchanged, and will continue to include a watermark referring to "New Zealand SPS Certificate", All existing security features will also remain unchanged. From 1 March 2013, live animals/germplasm export certificates will also utilise the same security paper as animal products.

Phytosanitary export cerificates forplants and plant products, grade certificates and OECD varietal certificates for seed will utilise new securitypaper thatincludes screen rulings to show multiple prints of 'COPY' across the certificate when the original version is scanned. The background of the paper will read 'New Zealand Government' and references to MAF and NZFSA will be replaced with 'New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries'.

## Changes to Security Devices

References to MAF, NZFSA or MFish and a series of numbers (e.g. NZFSA0044444) on official seals will be replaced with 'MPl' followed by the same series of numbers (e.g. MP10044444). Official seals include container bolt seals, Tyden seals, Mega Lock seals applied to shipping containers, and official carton seals.

References to MAF, NZFSA or MFish on official devices (including brands) will also be replaced with 'New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries', 'Ministry for Primary Industries' or 'MPP', as appropriate, from 1 March 2013.

## Letterhead Certificates (Registration Certificates/Free Sale Certificates/Organic Certificates/Grade Certificates/Wine Cerifificates)

Where a leiterhead assurance is required by an importing country (e.g, for registration of a product) any reference to 'MAF', 'NZFSA' or 'MFish' will be removed and replaced with 'New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries', 'Ministry for Primary Industries' or 'MPI', as appropriate from 1 March 2013.

## Signatory Seals (Official Stamps)

Two types of official stamps will be used when signing and stamping export cerificates or letterhead certificates (refer to appendix one) from 1 March 2013. A generic stamp will be utilised for phytosanitary cerificates, grade ceritificates and OECD varietal certificates. The unique identifier stamp will include the words 'official seal' and will be individually numbered and allocated to MPI official certifiers/authorised persons. The unique identifier stamp will be utilised for all export certificates for animal products (meat, dairy, seafood, inedible etc), live animals/germplasm, wine, organics, quota and IUU fish catch cerificates. Depending on the product-type in question, either type of stamp may be utilised on registration and free sale certificates.

## CHANGE OF NAME FOR THE NEW ZEALAND MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FORESTRY

Communication from New Zealand

1. The New Zealand Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry (MAF) is changing its name to reflect the new functions of the organization following its merger with the New Zealand Food Safety Authority and the Ministry of Fisheries last year.
2. The new ministry will be called the Ministry for Primary Industries. Its areas of responsibility will encompass all government work across the agricultural, horticultural, fisheries and aquaculture, forestry and food sectors, including imports and exports. The new ministry will continue to have primary responsibility for food safety and biosecurity
3. The new name will come into effect on 30 April 2012. The new logo of the Ministry for Primary Industries will simply be the New Zealand Government Coat of Arms. This will be phased in over time. Brands, official seals and logos, etc. used on official certificates will be updated at a later stage with notification, through New Zealand's oyerseas Posts, to counterpart authorities well in advance. (The name of the competent authority will also change to the Ministry for Primary Industries.) The change process is expected to run through to mid-2013.
4. Overseas authorities will continue to deal with the same (MAF) staff in the new ministry (MPI) that they are currently dealing with now Likewise the legislation currently administered by MAF will continue in the new ministry (MPI).

## Summary

We provide detail on new MPI seals and certification, following the amalgamation of MAF, NZFSA, Biosecurity and MFish, and request that posts inform competent authorities in their countries of accreditation of changes to take place from 1 March 2013.

* All Posts (except those mentioned immediately below) to inform competent authorities in their countries of accreditation of changes, using the "General" letter and supporting documents attached.

TND's Formal Message of 6 March 2012 refers.
2. The renaming and amalgamation of the former Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry, Ministry of Fisheries, Biosecurity New Zealand and New Zealand Food Safety Authority to the "Ministry for Primary Industries" means that nomenclature changes are required for all official assurances (on export documentation, e.g. data boxes for specific consignment details, health attestations, and signature provisions etc.) and associated security devices (e.g. security paper, official seals, official devices and stamps) for New Zealand agriculture exports. New templates and security devices will be used on export documentation from 1 March 2013.
3. The change to official assurances and associated security devices is a straightforward process, and
(to be distributed as per instructions in the "Action" section of this message) give more detail on the process. We ask that posts convey the letter to Competent Authorities through whatever mechanism (TPN, covering letter etc.) you judge to be most appropriate. You may also wish to distribute the letter more widely to other agencies (e.g., if relevant, Foreign Affairs, Trade, Commerce and Customs Ministries etc.) with the objective of ensuring that products shipped using new certificates do not face delay at borders from March next year.
4. Definition of Competent Authority: MPI is the New Zealand competent authority, recognised by the New Zealand Government as responsible and competent for developing sanitary and phyto-sanitary
measures and administering/supervising their implementation. SPS measures, as defined under the WTO SPS Agreement, are measures designed to protect human (food safety), animal or plant life or health. In practice, the competent authority is usually the Agriculture Ministry, but in many cases could also be a Food and Drug agency, Health Ministry, Quarantine authority etc.

7. MPI advises that a website setting out these changes will be established before 1 March 2013, to be used for information in case of any confusion. In that instance, exporters will be asked to share this with their importers and to attempt to resolve border issues themselves; posts and MPI will be called on only if that approach fails.
8. For GVA: In due course MPI is considering a broader notification to the WTO, especially to capture those countries to which New Zealand does not have formal accreditation. We will be in touch separately with you on this.

## Nomenclature changes to New Zealand Export Certificates and Official Seals and Devices

On 30 April 2012, the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry (MAF) changed its name to the Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI). This was to reflect the new functions of the Ministry following the New Zealand Government's decision to merge MAF with the New Zealand Food Safety Authority (NZFSA) and the Ministry of Fisheries (Mfish). These functions cover the horticulture, agriculture, aquaculture, fisheries, forestry and food sectors, and include protecting New Zealand primary industries from biological risk.

MPI is the New Zealand competent authority for all sanitary and phytosanitary matters, including those relating to food safety, animal and plant life and health. Given its broad functions and areas of accountability, MPI is the gateway to government for all of New Zealand's primary industries.

The New Zealand Government advised all trading partners last year of changes required to all sanitary and phytosanitary export certificates (official assurances) and associated security devices (e.g. security paper, official seals, signatory seals (official stamps) and official devices) as a result of the new name of the New Zealand competent authority. These changes take effect from 1 March 2013.

This letter provides an overview of the information already supplied to importing countries by the New Zealand government.

## Changes to Export Certificates

Sanitary and phytosanitary export certificates issued by the New Zealand Government will be changing from 1 March 2013 tô reflect the new name of New Zealand's primary regulator of food safety, animal and plant life and health.

References to the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry (MAF), the New Zealand Food Safety Authority (NZFSA), or the Ministry of Fisheries (MFish) will be removed from export certificates issued from the 1 March 2013 and replaced with the words 'New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries', 'Ministry for Primary Industries' or 'MPI'.

The export certificates affected by this change include:

- animal products (human consumption, animal consumption and inedible product)
- food and beverages
- live animals and germplasm
- plant and plant products
- illegal, unregulated and unreported (IUU) fish catch certificates

There will be no changes to the attestations provided by the New Zealand government.

## Changes to Security Paper

Export certificates are issued on paper that contains special security features to prevent fraudulent use.

Security paper and security features for sanitary export certificates for animal products (meat, dairy, seafood, non-edible etc), and IUU fish catch certificates will remain unchanged, and will continue to include a watermark referring to "New Zealand SPS Certificate". From 1 March 2013, live animals/germplasm export certificates will also utilise the same security paper as animal products.

Other export certificates, including phytosanitary certificates for plants and plant products, grade certificates, and OECD varietal certificates for seed will be issued on a new security paper. This security paper is green with New Zealand government in wavy lines in the background. When the original certificate is scanned or photocopied, multiple prints of 'COPY' appear across the certificate. An additional security feature of a fern hologram (in silyer) has been added to the bottom left comer.

## Changes to Security Devices

In addition to the changes to export certificate, all references to 'MAF', 'NZFSA' or 'Mfish' on official seals (i.e. container bolt seals, Tyden seals, Mega Lóck seals applied to shipping containers, and official carton seals) will be replaced with 'MPI' from 1 March 2013.

Two new of signatory seal (official stamps) will be used when signing and stamping export certificates and other types of assurances (e.g. registration/free sale certificates). Both stamps are green, include the words "Ministry for Primary Lndustries" and contain the New Zealand coat of arms. One stamp also includes the words "official seal" and is individually numbered and allocated to MPI official certifiers/authoris'sed persons. The second stamp is not numbered and does not include the words "official seal".

## Transitional Period

There will be a transition period during which both the old and new export certificates will be in use. This is due to export certificates issued prior to 1 March 2013 being in the current format, whereas certificates issued from 1 March 2013 will be in the new format, and reflects the shipping times from New Zealand to other countries.

Old official seals and official devices will also be in circulation after 1 March 2013. This is unavoidable as product sealed prior to 1 March 2013 with old carton seals and then chilled or frozen, cannot be replaced with new seals, as these will not permanently adhere to chilled or frozen product cartons.

## Changes to New Zealand Export Certificates

On 30 April 2012, the Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry (MAF) changed it name to the Ministry for Primary industries (MPI). This was to reflect the new functions of the Ministry following the New Zealand Governments decision to merge MAF with the New Zealand Food Safety Authority (NZFSA) and the Ministry of Fisheries (Mash)

In addition to the changes to export certificates, all references to 'MAF', 'NZFSA' or 'Kish' on official devices and official seals (ie. container boll seals, Tyoien seals, Mega Lock seals applied to shipping containers, and official carton seals) will be replaced with 'MP1'

Two new signatory seals (official stamps) will be used when signing and stamping export certificates and other hypes of assurances (egg. registration/free sale certificates). Both stamps are green, include the words "Ministry for Primary Industries" and contain the New Zealand cont of arms. One stamp also includes the words "official seal" and is individually numbered and allocated to MPI official ceriffers/auihcrised persons. The second stamp is not numbered and does not include the words "official seal".

These changes will also take effect from 1 March 2013

## Transitional Period

There will be a transition period during which both the old and new export certificates will be in use. Letest chapter in the Ninistry Name Change project has been completed.
On 1 March, all export certificates, advice notices, product registrations and security items provided for international distribution, simultaneously changed to the MPI brand.

Since the merger in April 2012, the Standards branch has been managing the name change transition for export certification and security devices. This is a substantial change with trade implications, with a project team involving several MPI Branches and Directorates. MPI allowed a considerable length of time from the April 2012 merger to ensure adequate communication with all our trading partners and stakeholders, as well as the opportunity for MPI to complete the necessary electronic and physical changes

As a result of a lot of hard work by the team, the transition has gone smoothly with no issues so far. Accomplishments include:

- over 100 countries received sequential notifications of the upcoming changes
- hundreds of stakeholders across plant, animal and animal products, dairy, wine, organics, and fisheries sectors were guided through this transition process
- over 700 e-cert templates and 379 export certificates were changed, with hundreds of attestations updated
- 149 unnecessary export certificates removed
- many, many hours of user acceptance testing ensuring a smooth electronic transition
- the successful design, production and distribution around the country of numerous rebranded security items, from official stamps and container seals to security paper and certificates
- over 15 types of old MAF, NZFSA, Fisheries official stamps across the organisation were simplified to two MPI stamps
