Over recent months, Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry (MAF) has undergone a lot of changes. The Ministry of Fisheries merged with MAF back in July, and forestry is now operating as part of the new Forestry and Land Operations directorate. Our work covers a range of forestry activities including Indigenous Forestry (issuing approvals, plans and permits), Indigenous Sawmilling, the Emissions Trading Scheme, the Permanent Forest Sink Initiative, the Afforestation Grant Scheme and the East Coast Forestry Project.

Latest news

The Forestry (Indigenous Timber Milling) Amendment Regulations came into effect on 1 January 2012 and introduced changes to indigenous timber sawmill reporting. All registered sawmillers were sent the new regulations and information in December (if you did not receive the information please contact us).

A "Milling and Exporting Swamp Kauri" fact sheet was recently produced by MAF, providing clarification around approvals required to mill and export swamp kauri. This can be found on the MAF website under "Indigenous Forestry". Please contact your regional office if you have any queries.

Sawmiller focus



Ray Thomas, Lake Brunner

Ray Thomas has been salvaging and milling old native logs from the bottom of Lake Brunner that were lost in the course of being transported across the lake from the forest.

He uses divers and a custom-built barge to re-float sunken logs and bring them ashore.

The heart timber has been preserved underwater and is in the same condition as the day it was cut down 50-100 years ago.

What is a Milling Statement?

A Milling Statement is a confirmation of the class of timber (e.g. salvage, windthrow and standing dead) and the source. Sawn timber may be sold or used for personal use. Registered sawmillers must obtain a copy of the Milling Statement before milling any timber from it.
