1 Purpose

(1) This guidance document has been issued to accompany Ovine and Caprine Semen to the United States of America (OMAR). This guidance document should be read in conjunction with that OMAR.

2 Specific guidance for the zoosanitary certificate

- (2) With regard to clause 2.2 Only the time period that applies to the donor animals should be left without strikeout. If a consignment contains animals that meet both periods no strikeout should be applied and the applicable period should be specified for each donor animal in a schedule.
- (3) With regard to clause 3.6 Species disease relevant to the commodity being certified i.e. ovine semen communicable diseases of sheep.
