1. Statutory authority

Pursuant to section 60, section 60A, section 62(1) and section 167 of the Animal Products Act 1999 I notify the following:

- (i) the issue under section 167 of the Overseas Market Access Requirements for bovine semen to Peninsular Malaysia, BOVSEM.MY dated 16 October 2018;
- (ii) the revocation and replacement of the Overseas Market Access Requirements for bovine semen to Peninsular Malaysia, OMAR B BOVSEMEC.MAL 09.07.03- BOVINE SEMEN TO PENINSULAR MALAYSIA dated 21 July 2003;
- (iii) the determination under section 62(1) of the format and content of the official assurance for bovine semen to Peninsular Malaysia.

This notice takes effect from the 16 October 2018.

2. Peninsular Malaysia requirements

Bovine semen exported from New Zealand to Peninsular Malaysia must be accompanied by an official assurance in the form of a completed zoosanitary certificate.

The zoosanitary certificate as specified below must be completed and certified, after due enquiry, by an Official Veterinarian of the Ministry for Primary Industries.

Explanatory note:

If the zoosanitary certificate is not certified then the bovine semen does not satisfy the conditions in the notice. Likewise, if the bovine semen does not satisfy the zoosanitary requirements in the certificate, then the certificate will not be certified.

1. Country freedom

1.1 New Zealand is free from bluetongue, brucellosis (*Brucella abortus*), bovine spongiform encephalopathy, contagious bovine pleuropneumonia, foot and mouth disease, lumpy skin disease, rinderpest and vesicular stomatitis.

Vaccination against these diseases is prohibited in New Zealand

2. Semen collection centre

- 2.1 The semen collection centre at which the semen was collected:
 - 2.1.1 is approved by the New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries as having facilities suitable for collecting, processing and storing semen
 - 2.1.2 is under the direct supervision and sanitary control of a centre veterinarian who is approved by the New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries and is responsible for the hygiene of the centre and the health of the animals
 - 2.1.3 is regularly inspected by a veterinary officer approved by the New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries.

3. Semen collection centre status

3.1 In the 12 months prior to the date of the initial collection of semen for this consignment no clinical cases of bovine genital campylobacteriosis, bovine tuberculosis, leptospirosis and trichomoniasis have occurred on the semen collection centre.

4. Pre-collection period

- 4.1 The donor bulls were resident in the semen collection centre, under veterinary supervision, for at least 6 months prior to the collection of semen for this consignment.
- 4.2 During the pre-collection period the donor bulls did not perform natural service.

5. Testing and treatments

- 5.1 Donor bulls were resident on a semen collection centre and were tested, with negative results for the following diseases within the 12 month period immediately prior to semen collection:
 - 5.1.1 Campylobacter fetus subsp. venerealis using culture examination of preputial washings

- 5.1.2 *Trichomonas fetus* using microscopic examination and culture examination of preputial washings
- 5.1.3 bovine tuberculosis using an intradermal test applied to the caudal fold using bovine tuberculin. Results were read after 72 hours

6. Semen collection and storage

6.1	The semen was collected, processed, identified, and stored in accordance with the recommendations of the <i>OIE Terrestrial Animal Health Code</i> .
