The requirements listed in this Importing Country's Phytosanitary Requirement (ICPR) document apply to product of New Zealand only, unless specifically stated.

This ICPR specifies Iran's phytosanitary requirements. If a commodity or commodity group is not identified within this ICPR exporters should direct enquiries to:

- Iran directly to ascertain requirements

or

- Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) - Plant Exports

Users of this document are strongly advised to review all sections of the ICPR for the determination of a commodity's phytosanitary requirements.

Import permit and phytosanitary certificate required. Additional declarations required. Bulbs must be free from soil, plant residues and weed seeds.

Additional declarations:

“The bulbs are free from pests and quarantine diseases in particular; *Aphelenchiodes fragariae*, Dasheen mosaic virus and Zantedeschia mosaic virus”.

And

“The growing site was surveyed and found free from *Globodera pallida* and *Globodera rostochiensis*”

And

“The growing site has been microscopically examined during cultivation by the NPPO and found free from live parasitic nematodes and other harmful organisms and the consignment has been inspected and found free of live parasitic nematodes and other harmful organisms by the NPPO”

4.4 Seeds, Grains and Nuts

4.4.1 Seeds, Grains and Nuts for Sowing

Conditions:

Import permit required

Brassica napus var napus

Rapeseed

Conditions:

Phytosanitary certificate and additional declaration required. Treatment to be specified on the certificate.

Consignment must be free from soil, crop residue, weed seeds, live insects and plant disease symptoms.

Additional Declaration:

Consignment is free from *Leptosphaeria maculans* and *Plasmodiophora brassica*.

Treatment:

Consignment must be treated with a suitable fungicide and must be stated on the phytosanitary certificate.

Note: To verify the consignment is free from *Leptosphaeria maculans* and *Plasmodiophora brassicae*, the IVA is required to sight the treatment certificate and seed testing certificate for methodology results.

Glycine max

Soybean

Conditions:

Phytosanitary certificate and additional declaration required. Treatment to be specified on the certificate.

Consignment must be free from soil, crop residue, weed seeds, live insects and plant disease symptoms.

Additional Declaration:

Consignment is free from *Pseudomonas savastanoi pv glycinea*, *Pseudomonas savastanoi pv. phaseolicola*, *Pseudomonas syringae pv tabaci* and *Olpidium brassicae*.

Treatment:

Consignment must be treated with a suitable fungicide and must be stated on the phytosanitary certificate.

Note: To verify the consignment is free from *Pseudomonas savastanoi pv. glycinea*, *Pseudomonas savastanoi pv. phaseolicola*, *Pseudomonas syringae pv. tabaci* and *Olpidium brassicae*, the IVA is required to sight the treatment certificate and seed testing certificate for methodology results.
