The requirements listed in this Importing Country's Phytosanitary Requirement (ICPR) document apply to product of New Zealand only, unless specifically stated. This standard specifies Niue's phytosanitary requirements. If a commodity or commodity group is not identified within this ICPR exporters should contact:
