Fruit free from bacterial attack (in particular *Erwinia amylovora*) or from serious fungal attack"

Allium cepa

Phytosanitary import permit required. Phytosanitary certificate and additional declaration required. Consignment must be free of leaves and branches.

Pyrus communis
