1.2 Scope

The requirements listed in this ICPR apply to product of New Zealand only, unless specifically stated.

This document specifies Vanuatu's phytosanitary requirements for the stated commodities only. If a commodity is not listed under either Section 3 "Commodity Class Requirements" or Section 4 "Commodity Specific Requirements" exporters should contact

 Vanuatu's authorities directly in order to ascertain requirements. Refer Section 2.2.4

or

• The Ministry for Primary Industries (Plant Exports).

Users of this document are strongly advised to review all sections of the ICPR for the determination of a commodity's phytosanitary requirements.

1.3 Phytosanitary Legislation

The following legislation controls the importation of plants and plant materials into Vanuatu:

- Import of Plants Act 1988
- Rhinoceros Beetle Act 1988
- Plant Protection Act (currently before Parliament).

1.4 Fees and Charges

2 General Requirements

2.1 **Prohibitions**

No commodities of New Zealand origin are prohibited entry to Vanuatu

2.2 Phytosanitary Import Permits

- 2.2.1 Phytosanitary Import Permits state the phytosanitary requirements for importation
- 2.2.2 Import permits are required for the importation of the following commodity classes from New Zealand:
 - Fresh Fruit and Vegetables
 - Cut Flowers and Foliage
 - Nursery Stock
 - Seed (grains) / Nuts
- 2.2.3 Import permits are not required for the importation of the following commodity class from New Zealand:
 - Frozen Fruit and Vegetables
 - Growing Media / Packing Material.
- 2.2.4 Import permits and conditions of import may be requested from Biosecurity Vanuatu:

2.3 Phytosanitary Certificates

2.3.1 Phytosanitary certificates are required for the importation of the following commodity classes from New Zealand

- Fresh Fruit and Vegetables
- Cut flowers and Foliage
- Nursery Stock
- Seed (grains) / Nuts
- 2.3.2 Phytosanitary certificates are not required for the importation of the following commodity class from New Zealand
 - Frozen Fruit and Vegetables
 - Growing Media / Packing Material

2.4 Quarantine Pests

NOTE: Vanuatu has not specified a quarantine pest list. The pests listed below are pests which have been intercepted and classified as 'quarantine pests' by Vanuatu. A 0.5% MPL must be applied for the pests listed below and 5% MPL for all other pests.

Cartodere (Aridius) nodifer Necrobia ruficeps(N. rufipes)

2.5 Ports of Entry

Commodity classes are not restricted to entry via specific ports.

Import permit required. Phytosanitary certificate not required.

3.1.3 Frozen Fruit / Vegetables

<u>Conditions</u> Import permit and phytosanitary certificate not required.

3.2 Cut Flowers / Foliage

3.2.1 Fresh Cut Flowers / Foliage

<u>Conditions</u> Import permit and phytosanitary certificate required.

3.2.2 Dried Cut Flowers / Foliage

<u>Conditions</u> Import permit and phytosanitary certificate required.

3.3 Nursery stock

3.3.1 Bud wood / Cuttings

<u>Conditions</u> Import permit and phytosanitary certificate required.

3.3.2 Bulbs/tubers/corms/rhizomes (for propagation) Conditions Import permit and phytosanitary certificate required.

3.3.3 Whole Plants

<u>Conditions</u> Import permit and phytosanitary certificate required.

3.4 Seeds and Grain

3.4.1 Seed and Grain for Sowing
