MPI proposes to add the following new MRLs to the MRL Standards: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 4 mg/kg in beetroot for clopyralid when used as a herbicide;• 0.05 mg/kg in grapes and 0.01(*) mg/kg winter squash for cyflufenamid when used as a fungicide;• 0.01(*) mg/kg in maize for fluthiacet-methyl when used as a herbicide• 0.05 mg/kg in bulb onions and 0.05 mg/kg in citrus for spinetoram when used as an insecticide
