Seed for sowing – Capsicum (all Capsicum species); Solanum (all Brugmansia species, Solanum jasminoides, and Physalis peruviana)

Nursery stock – Chrysanthemum ( all Argyranthemum and Chrysanthemum species); Dahlia (all Dahlia species); Diascia (all Diascia species); Solanum (all Browallia, Brunfelsia, Calibrachoa, Cestrum, Fabiana, Iochroma, Nierembergia, Petunia, and Scopolia species)

	These pathways, along with those already listed in the standard ( <i>Solanum tuberosum</i> true seed and nursery stock, <i>Solanum lycopersicum</i> seed, and <i>Persea</i> spp. nursery stock), must now meet the Ministry for Primary Industries requirements for PSTVd as specified in the relevant import health standard.
