#### **Title**

Guidance Document: Natural Sausage Casings

#### About this document

This guidance document contains information about acceptable ways of ensuring compliance with the requirements in the *Import Health Standard (IHS): Natural Sausage Casings*.

Any guidance on how to comply with the applicable requirements may not be the only way to achieve compliance. Stakeholders are encouraged to discuss departures from the approaches outlined in this guidance document with the Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI) to avoid expending resources on the development of alternative approaches which may later be considered unsuitable.

The term "must" is not typically used in guidance. In this particular document if the term "must" is used, it is used in the context of quoting or paraphrasing the requirements set out in the related *IHS: Natural Sausage Casings*.

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# 1 Purpose

- (1) This guidance document has been issued to accompany the *IHS: Natural Sausage Casings*. This guidance document should be read in conjunction with that IHS.
- (2) This document includes:
  - Countries with MPI-approved exporting systems to import natural sausage casings into New Zealand.
  - b) Model veterinary certificate.
  - c) Negotiated country specific veterinary certificates for limited species.

# 2 Background

- (1) The IHS: Natural Sausage Casings, which this guidance document accompanies, contains generic import requirements. These are the rules to manage the biosecurity risk of importing sausage casings from all countries that can meet the requirements of the IHS and in doing so meet New Zealand's appropriate level of protection. The generic IHS serves as the basis for country-to-country (bilateral) negotiations. This guidance document contains a model veterinary certificate and bilaterally-agreed veterinary certificates for trade in natural sausage casings. These country-specific veterinary certificates represent what will be certified prior to exporting consignments of natural sausage casings from the country specified.

# 4 Importer Responsibilities

(1) The costs to MPI in performing functions relating to the importation of natural sausage casings will be recovered in accordance with the Biosecurity Act 1993 (the Act) and any regulations made under that Act. All costs involved with documentation, transport, storage and obtaining a biosecurity clearance must be covered by the importer or agent.

# 5 Guidance

# 5.1 Equivalence

- (1) MPI may accept an alternative method, system or process that can be shown to achieve the biosecurity requirements of the IHS (i.e. equivalence).
- (2) MPI's preference is that the exporting country's Competent Authority makes equivalence requests. Equivalence requests can be lodged with <a href="mailto:animalimports@mpi.govt.nz">animalimports@mpi.govt.nz</a>
- (3) Note that a permit to import is not required to import natural sausage casings into New Zealand provided the requirements of the IHS are met.
- (4) A permit may be required where specific equivalence measures are approved by MPI other than by a negotiated veterinary certificate as specified in the IHS.

#### 5.2 Food Act 1981 and Animal Products Act 1999

- (1) Commercial consignments of products imported into New Zealand for human consumption must comply with relevant requirements of the Food Act 1981, the Food Act 2014 as it comes into force, and the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code. Importers of food intended for sale for human consumption must be listed with MPI. These requirements are independent of the IHS requirements. - (2) The importation of the following animal material or product must comply with the inspection requirements issued in Overseas Market Access Requirements (OMAR) 01/172 under the Animal Products Act 1999:
  - a) Imported animal material or product, or product containing animal material or product, that is of New Zealand origin and have been returned to New Zealand for domestic sale or use, or for reexport, and
  - Imported animal material or product of foreign origin intended for export or further processing for export.
- (3) A prerequisite requirement of this OMAR is Biosecurity clearance. # 5.3 Incorporation of material by reference

- (1) Incorporation by reference means that standards, guidelines or lists are incorporated into the IHS and they form part of the requirements. This is done because technical documents are too large or impractical to include in the IHS.
- (2) Where the IHS states that section 142O(1) of the Act does not apply, this means that importers need to refer to the most recent version of any standards, guidelines or lists that are incorporated by reference in the IHS.

# 5.4 Exporting country systems and certification

#### 5.4.1 Approval for exporting systems

- (1) MPI recommends Competent Authorities that request the approval of their exporting systems refer to Section 3 of the *Code* titled *Quality of Veterinary Services*, to prepare evidence for MPI regarding capabilities and preferences of the exporting country's Competent Authority.
- (2) The table below lists those exporting countries that meet the requirements set out in the *IHS: Natural Sausage Casings*.

#### 5.4.2 Agreed county specific veterinary certificates

- (1) Requests from exporting countries to negotiate veterinary certification for the import of natural sausage casings into New Zealand will be prioritised according to MPI resources available at the time of application.
- (2) A model veterinary certificate is provided in this guidance document and can be used by the Competent Authority as a reference for country-specific veterinary certificate negotiation.
- (3) All country-specific veterinary certificates agreed between an exporting country's Competent Authority and MPI are included in the table below:

- \*New veterinary certificate has not been negotiated as of June 2015
- (5) Country-specific veterinary certificates with equivalent measures will be recorded with a number relevant to a Chief Technical Officer (CTO) direction under section 27(1)d(iii) of the Act, to enable border staff to clear the goods and record the number in the MPI database.
- (6) When a newly negotiated country-specific veterinary certificate replaces one which is currently in use, the application of new import conditions will apply according to the dates listed in the table. At that time previous veterinary certificates for that country can no longer be used.
- (7) After issue of the IHS, the measures may be used by countries which already have an agreed veterinary certificate. Using the measures before a new country-specific veterinary certificate is agreed can create challenges at the time of biosecurity clearance. MPI should be notified prior to their use in order to provide clarification to border staff.
- (8) When a country-specific veterinary certificate is agreed, there will be a four-month transition period to allow donors to be prepared in accordance with the new conditions. During transition, both the old and the new import conditions are acceptable. After transition, the previous veterinary certificate for that country can no longer be used.
- (9) Currently there are three country-specific veterinary certificates for natural sausage casings imports into New Zealand, as indicated above.

# 5.5 Retorted product

(1) The requirements for retorted product are stated in the MPI <u>IHS: Importing Specified Foods for Human Consumption Containing Animal Products.</u>

# 5.6 Inspection and verification

- (1) On arrival, all documentation accompanying the consignment will be verified by an inspector. The inspector may also inspect the consignment, or a sample of the consignment on arrival.
- (2) Inspectors are able to inspect and verify due to their authorised powers under the Act.
- (3) These requirements are independent of the IHS requirements.

# 6 Certificates for Natural Sausage Casings

- (1) Below is a model veterinary certificate for trade in natural sausage casings. This model meets the requirements of the IHS.
- (2) This model veterinary certificate format is based on the *Code* Chapter 5.10.4 for model veterinary certificates for international trade in Animal Products.
