## Titi/Muttonbird Islands customary regulations - Additional information sent to submitters in November 2014

Following a query from a submitter, MPI is providing the following further information to submitters to clarify what has happened in regard to the proposal since 2010.

In 2010, following submissions by fishing industry bodies, Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu amended its proposal to reduce the impact on commercial paua harvesters. From then to 2014 Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu and commercial representatives were negotiating to try to resolve points of disagreement.

The amendments made by Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu in 2010 are:




Figure 6 - Proposed closures showing original (blue dotted line) and final proposed boundaries

- three adjustments to boundaries: Pikomamakuiti; Herekopare; and Tia Island (see Fig. 6, below).
- two of the areas which were originally proposed to be closed to commercial harvesting of paua and kina (Solomons and Poho a Tairea) are now proposed to be closed to the commercial harvesting of kina, only (see table and maps below).

There are no other changes to the proposal. However, further submissions may lead to further changes.

The submitter also enquired about how many people go mutton-birding, where they are located and when they are on the islands. MPI does not hold that information. However, Te Rūnanga o Ngāi Tahu advises that:

- the exact numbers of birders is unknown, though significant
- birders are located on the islands named below or immediately adjacent, as well as others;
  and
- birders are resident on the islands during the birding season (April/May), with additional time either side of the season for preparation, tidying up, repairs and maintenance.








