Cats and Dogs: Non-compliant External Parasite Treatment – Advised Pre-Arrival

CTO direction to biosecurity inspectors for the clearance of cats and dogs with a non-compliant external parasite treatment

Pursuant to section 27(1)(d)(iii) of the Biosecurity Act 1993 I, Marnie Thomas, Manager Animal Imports, Ministry for Primary Industries (under delegated authority), give the following directions for a dog to be given clearance in accordance with the following measures, different from those in the applicable import health standard: Import Health Standard Cats and Dogs [CATDOG.GEN].

IHS Clause 2.2: Equivalence is given to allow one treatment effective against fleas and ticks in post-arrival quarantine.

The post-arrival inspections and treatment in post-arrival quarantine mitigate the risk of introducing exotic external parasites into New Zealand.

This direction takes effect from the date of signing and continues in effect until amended or revoked.
